DEA National Prescription Take-Back Day April 27, 2019

Location: YCSO Foothills Substation, 13190 E. South Frontage Road – Yuma, AZ

The Yuma County Sheriff's Office will be participating in the Drug Enforcement Administration's (DEA) National Prescription Take-Back Day on **Saturday, April 27, 2019** from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. Medications for disposal can be dropped off at the YCSO Foothills Substation at 13190 E. South Frontage Road (The DEA cannot accept liquids, needles or sharps; only pills or patches). This service is free and anonymous, no questions asked.

This is the DEA's 17th take-back event, providing the public the opportunity to prevent pill abuse and theft by ridding their homes of potentially dangerous expired, unused, and unwanted prescription drugs.

Last October, more than 4,700 federal, state and local law enforcement partners took in 457.12 tons (914,236 pounds) of unused, expired or unwanted prescription drugs at 5,839 collection sites across the United States. Overall, in its 16 previous Take Back events, the DEA and its partners have taken in 10,878,950 million pounds (5,439.5 tons) of used prescription drugs.

This initiative addresses a vital public safety and public health issue. Medicines that languish in home cabinets are highly susceptible to diversion, misuse, and abuse. Rates of prescription drug abuse in the U.S. are alarmingly high, as are the number of accidental poisonings and overdoses due to these drugs. Studies show that a majority of abused prescription drugs are obtained from family and friends, including from the home medicine cabinet. In addition, Americans are now advised that their usual methods for disposing of unused medicines—flushing them down the toilet or throwing them in the trash—both pose potential safety and health hazards.
